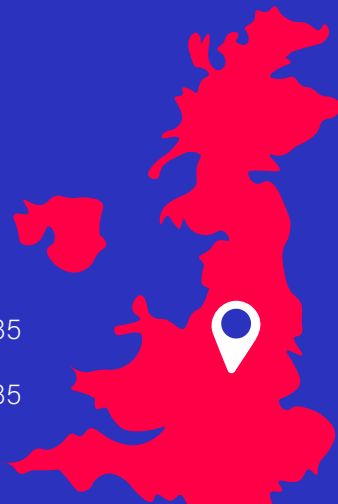

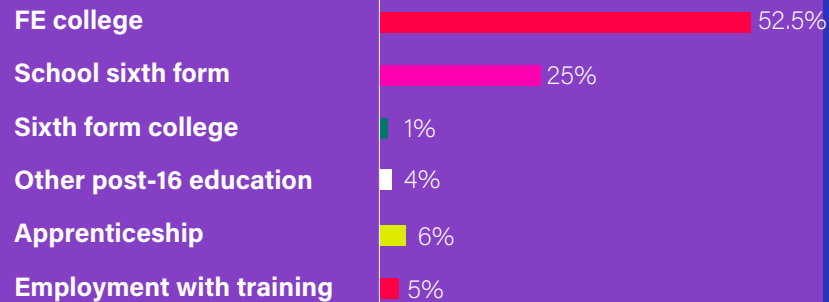
## How much do people earn?

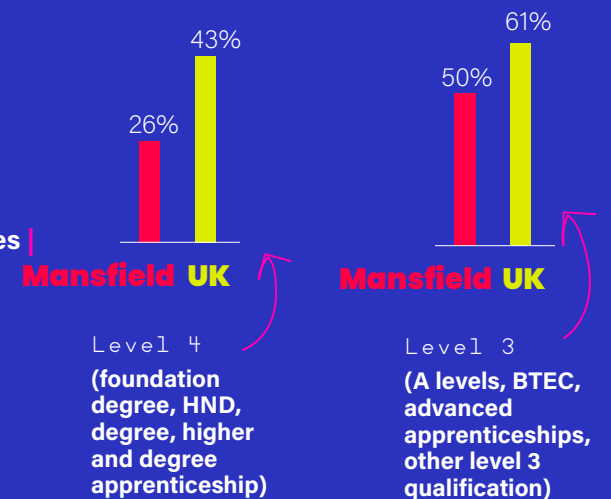
